This eight movement Suite is divided into three Groups, with Prelude as the opening of the entire work. Group One, includes Prelude as well as Carol and Christmas Dance, and is a set that Joan Ellesick and I have played at Christ Lutheran during the Christmas season. Vaughan Williams dedicated the Suite to violist Lionel Tertis who premiered the work with Malolm Sargent conducting in London. Call to Action



Through our connections with MISN, we became aware of 'David' in early December. Six years ago, David was living in Worcester with his family. Although he was born in the US Virgin Islands (and therefore a US citizen), David was arrested by ICE, and ultimately held for six years in an Alabama detention center. He was released for reasons unknown on November 30 and provided transportation back to the Boston area. A small group of folks, including members of CLC, have been working to provide him the means to get back on his feet and, with help from Ascentria Care Alliance, to identify long-term housing in Worcester. With friends from other churches and organizations, we are hoping to be able to cover his basic expenses for three months, while he finds work and begins to re-imagine what it is to be free. We estimate that it will cost approximately \$2,400 for three months. The hope is that this will be shared by two or three congregations. David is very motivated to find a job, to begin working and to continue with his life. He just needs a little assistance to begin.
