

# Music Notes Tom Berryman, Music Director



The "Queen of Chorales," "Wie schön leuchtet der Morgenstern" (ELW 308 "O morning star, how fair and bright") features prominently this **Sunday**, **January 31**, Epiphany V. Theologian and pastor, Philipp Nicolai (1596-1608) composed the tune and the seven stanza text, perhaps in response to a Black Death outbreak in 1597.

The Prelude this Sunday is Dietrich Buxtehude's (1637-1707) chorale-prelude on "Wie schön leuchtet der Morgenstern," for organ.

For the the Postlude this Sunday, Hugo Distler's (1908-42) setting of Nicolai's hymn ("How lovely shines the morning star") features CLC voices with Anne Weaver, flute, Andrew Avalos, clarinet and Joan Ellersick, viola.

#### **Adult Forum**

This week in the adult forum, as part of our ongoing discussion about implicit bias and systemic racism, we'll see a documentary examining the ongoing effects of redlining. *Rats* focuses on areas of Baltimore where redlining deterred investment in Black neighborhoods and depressed property values, the same neighborhoods where poverty, poor health, and-yes-rats continue to plague residents. The documentary lasts nearly a full hour, so participants are asked to join in a little early, at 8:50 rather than 9:00 a.m.

Readers will have a 6-week head start on next month's selection, *The Sport of Kings*, a novel which weighs in at 560 pages. A finalist for the Pulitzer Prize written by C. E. Moore, *The Sport of Kings* is an American tale centered on a horse and two families: one white, a Southern dynasty whose forefathers were among the founders of Kentucky; the other African-American, the descendants of their slaves. A sweeping narrative of wealth and poverty, racism and rage, *The Sport of Kings* is an unflinching portrait of lives cast in the shadow of slavery and a moral epic for our time.
