The Social Justice Committee, with zealous advocacy from Rolf Larson, especially, has been taking steps toward Christ Lutheran Church's lead role in the sponsorship of an asylee family.

CLC has a long history of walking alongside migrants, from the welcome of Displaced Persons following WWII, to the sponsorship of a Vietnamese refugee family in the 1970s, to the purchase of a minibus, filled with quilts and clothing, shipped to Cristo Rey in El Paso last year.

Sponsorship of an asylee family is a huge undertaking, as asylees, while legally authorized to be in the USA, remain undocumented and unable to work legally for quite some time, as their cases move slowly through Immigration Court.

We hope that the congregation as a whole will support this effort, both with hands-on accompaniment and financial support. Watch for updates as we move closer to making an official decision.




March 1st marked a National Day of Mourning for COVID-19. The Floral Heart Project will be laying a

heart-shaped garland of roses on Natick Common in Natick Center at 5pm on Monday, March 1st in honor of the lives lost in our community and in sympathy and love for all those suffering. **The floral heart will remain on Natick Common through 5pm on March 8th.** Over 80 similar floral hearts will be laid <u>across</u> <u>the country</u> on that day, many at 5pm local time. Other Massachusetts locations include Cambridge, Boston, Lynnfield, and Medfield. (If you are not local to Natick, see if there is a floral heart close to you!)

The Sport of Kings, by C.E. Morgan is described as a "gothic tale of Southern decadence". Set in the horse country of Kentucky, it follows the generational stories of two families: one, white, the Forges, proud settlers who had moved out from Virginia to claim territory in the region; the other, a black family, Allmon Shaugnessy, his mother Marie, and her father, the Reverend, living near the polluted river's edge of Cincinnati.
