

The *Triduum*, or Great Three Days, begin on Maundy Thursday, continuing Good Friday and culminating in the Easter Vigil, and are the very heart of the Christian year, celebrating Jesus' Passion and Resurrection, by which we are freed from fear and sin and death to love our neighbor. Do plan to join your siblings in Christ for these Zoom liturgies, at 7:30 p.m. on Thursday and Friday, and 8:00 p.m. on Saturday, and don't forget to check your Holy Week and Easter packets for items to contribute to the services.

Webinar on Asylee Sponsorship:

Work toward the accompaniment of an asylee family progresses. If you'd like to become more engaged in the process, you are invited to a two-part webinar offered by the ELCA AMMPARO program. (AMMPARO stands for Accompanying Migrant Minors with Protection, Advocacy, Representation and Opportunity) and Episcopal Migration Ministries (EMM). It will cover background information about the asylum process, a bit of history, how to prepare for accompaniment, including 'how to' information, do's and don'ts, challenges, resources available, and more.
