



Late last fall, as the number of people seeking asylum in the U.S. grew rapidly, Christ Lutheran Church, an ELCA "Welcoming Congregation," was approached by the Executive Director of AMMPARO (Accompanying Migrant Minors with Protection, Advocacy, Representation and Opportunities) with a request to consider sponsorship (accompaniment) of an asylee family, and we began exploring what that would mean and require, both financially and personally.

Our best educated estimate was that it would require \$100,000 over a two-year period, and lesser, but still significant support for some time thereafter -- asylum-seekers are not legally permitted to work while their cases are pending -- and considerable support with tasks like accessing English classes, medical care, legal assistance, grocery shopping, and the like, as well as finding and setting up an apartment, cultural acclimation, negotiating public transit, and other matters. Over these months we have been building a network with several other congregations in the MetroWest area, and undertaking some early fundraising, anticipating that we might be ready to welcome a family in late spring or early summer. To date, we have received pledges of approximately \$68,000 from all sources, the majority from individual donors from CLC, and established relationships with about ten other congregations interested in participating.

As we learned more about the process, we became acquainted with the pastor from the bishop's office in the Southwest Texas Synod of the ELCA, who, in partnership with her counterpart in the Episcopal Diocese of the same region, is the de facto coordinator of these sponsorships. She contacted us last Friday and told us of a family of four from Togo (in West Africa, next to Ghana), a father, mother, infant, and toddler, ready to be connected with a sponsoring congregation; and she hoped that we might be

ready and able to welcome them, the sooner the better.

Although the timetable was not what we had planned on, it was felt that we were far enough along that the leap of faith in saying "yes" was one worth taking. At a special Council meeting Sunday evening, the CLC Council approved our moving forward as the lead congregation within the developing consortium to receive the family-as soon as this week! Initial plans for arranging temporary housing, transportation from Logan, and early meals are underway, and there will be numerous opportunities for members to become engaged once the family arrives. We will keep everyone updated as appropriate. In the meantime, please pray for "our" family as they prepare to embark on this next leg of what has surely been a long and arduous journey, and for all who will offer an initial welcome to greater Boston.
