Weekday Reflection for Wednesday, June 23, 2021Psalm 65Joshua 10:1-14Mark 6:45-52

⁴⁵Immediately he made his disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side, to Bethsaida, while he dismissed the crowd. ⁴⁶After saying farewell to them, he went up on the mountain to pray.

47When evening came, the boat was out on the sea, and he was alone on the land. ⁴⁸When he saw that they were straining at the oars against an adverse wind, he came towards them early in the morning, walking on the sea. He intended to pass them by. ⁴⁹But when they saw him walking on the sea, they thought it was a ghost and cried out; ⁵⁰for they all saw him and were terrified. But immediately he spoke to them and said, "Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid." ⁵¹Then he got into the boat with them and the wind ceased. And they were utterly astounded, ⁵²for they did not understand about the loaves, but their hearts were hardened.

For reflection:

After working hard and feeding the multitude, Jesus takes time apart to pray. How easy or difficult do you find it to take time to rest in God and be renewed in your spirit? Where do you find that re-creation?

The disciples fail to understand what God is doing in Jesus, in spite of their close relationship to him. What might harden your heart to Jesus' work? What opens it?

Prayer:

Lord Jesus, we would rather be safe on dry land, but you bring us out to the stormy seas. Give us faith to know that, in you, we are kept secure, even in the midst of life's tempests. Amen.
