

## CLC Family Promise Host Week in Progress: June 20 - 27, 2021

While Family Promise shelter families have been housed in hotels since March 2020, host congregations continue to provide groceries and any needed additional support during our scheduled "host week".

Currently, there are 5 adults and 4 children, aged 5,6, 13 and 16, in shelter. Other families are active with Family Promise through the LIFE (homeless prevention) and SAIL (transitional living) programs. So far this year, more than 50 families have been served between the three initiatives. This number already exceeds those served in all of 2020, which itself was a record-breaking year.

Since families in shelter are currently cooking their own meals, host congregations have been asked to provide non-perishable, mostly single serving groceries to stock an in-house food pantry accessible to any family currently in service with Family Promise.

Last week, CLC delivered a wide variety of single serve juice boxes, crackers, granola bars, cereals, breakfast drinks, dried fruit, and canned vegetables, among other items, that will be used to fill summer-time lunch boxes as kids head off to camp and other activities.

Thanks again to all for the grocery fund donations collected earlier this year, which were used to pay for the food bank items, and for your general support of this important mission!!
