At last week's meeting, the Congregation Council voted to accept the recommendation of an ad hoc group appointed to advise the council on the use of the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loan that Christ Lutheran Church received last year, and which has now been forgiven, becoming a grant.

CLC received about \$31,000 from the federal government to guard against catastrophic monetary shortfalls related to the COVID-19 pandemic. When we applied, it was with the understanding that, although CLC has enjoyed robust giving over the past several years, we did not know how the pandemic would affect us, and that, if it turned out not to be needed, we were free to distribute the funds to other worthy organizations.

The Congregation Council agreed to retain \$6100 as a hedge against a small number of expenses directly tied to COVID, and to distribute the remaining \$25,000 equally among the following organizations:

Resurrection Lutheran Church, Roxbury; Iglesia Luterana Cristo Rey, El Paso; Ascentria Care Alliance; the Jehu Jones Fund supporting Black ELCA pastors whose income and pensions contributions have not met standards; and the Natick Service Council.

If, when the pandemic might be called ended, we do not require the \$6100 retained, we will revisit the distribution of those dollars as well.



All are reminded that worship this week, **August 1 at 10:00 a.m.** will be on **Zoom**, while both Pr. Bourret and Tom Berryman are on vacation. Our thanks to Pr. Amanda Gerken-Nelson, who is supplying for Pr. Bourret, and Anders Carlson, who is covering for Tom. Pr.
