

A Reflection on Baptism

As we re-entered the nave for our first indoor worship on July 11 we were greeted by the presence of a new baptismal font, a generously proportioned glass bowl resting on upraised arms of wood. It seems a fitting reminder of our passage from the prisonlike bonds of 16 months of pandemic restrictions to the new life to be found in our beloved community gathered in worship under one roof.

The Worship, Music, and Visual Arts Committee grappled for several years over the design, materials, and placement of a new font. We wanted an ample, generous basin of water that signified the immersion of our sinful selves into the cleansing waters of our baptism into the death and life of Christ. We sought materials that were in harmony with the architecture of the space, that reflected its contemporary aesthetic. And we wanted to place it near the entrance of the nave to convey baptism as the entrance to the community of faith. Then we found the artisans to create the bowl and stand: George Scott, a glassmaker in Seattle, Washington, and Wally Long, craftsman and woodworker, a member of our congregation.

We celebrate their gifts as well as the generosity of families who made this new font possible. We are renewed by this beautiful furnishing of our worship space.

We resume **in-person worship this Sunday, August 8, at 10 a.m.** The Rev. John Stendahl will lead worship this week.


Adult Formation


