

Christ Lutheran Church returned to in-person worship on Sunday, a joyful celebration of Holy Communion following the *Of the Land and Seasons* setting. The service was also livestreamed on YouTube. To view the service, go to CLC's YouTube Channel, "Christ Lutheran Church Natick." We plan to continue to worship primarily in person as long as COVID-19 conditions remain favorable, with the service livestreamed for those who can't or are not yet comfortable attending in person. If you are unable to attend in person, and would like to receive Communion at home, please contact Pr. Bourret.

Please note: on August 1, we will worship via Zoom only.

Fully vaccinated people are not required to wear masks. We urge anyone who is not fully vaccinated to either view the service on YouTube, or plan to be masked and remain at a distance from others. For Holy Communion, Pastor Bourret distributes pita (or gluten-free wafers) with clean hands, and the communion assistant distributes wine or grape juice from well-spaced, individual glasses.

The nursery will be staffed beginning July 18. Nursery attendants will remain masked, and children over three years of age are expected to wear masks as well; for younger children, it is up to the parents' discretion.


