

This paraphrase of the holy communion service reminds us of our connection to the

Sunday, August 15 is observed in the Lutheran and Episcopal Church as a lesser festival, *Mary, Mother of Our Lord.* In the Roman Catholic and Orthodox churches, August 15 is the Feast of the Assumption of Mary, a major day in their liturgical calendars. Musically, we will "salute" Mary in our Hymn of the Day, "Canticle of the Turning" (ELW 723) and in the Offertory Music, "A Christmas Carol" from the musical show *Songs for a New World* (1995) by Jason Robert Brown, sung by Anna Carlson. The song concludes:



With the release of the United Nations report this week on global warming there could not be a more timely read than *The Overstory* by Richard Powers. A sobering, sweeping novel that tells the stories of nine main characters and their encounters with trees--lots of trees--*The Overstory* engages the reader in the complex, emerging understanding of the interconnectedness of trees and our human connectedness with them. Building on the revelations of Peter Wohleben's *The Hidden Life of Trees*, this gripping novel draws on Powers' rich imagination to tell a story that involves us all.
