This **Sunday, October 31, the Festival of Reformation**, two young people from our community will make public affirmation of their faith. Be present to support Anna Carlson and Kirsten Kirleis as they offer their personal faith statements and lay claim to the Church's faith as confessed in the Apostles' Creed. We'll celebrate with them and their families at coffee hour. Two weeks hence, Henrik Stjernfeldt will follow suit.

In two Sundays, on November 7, we will observe All Saints' Sunday in the morning. There will be a large pad in the parish hall this week, where you may write the names of any of your loved ones who have died, and, if you wish, you may add a brief note about them, or their lifespans. These names will be included in the prayers on November 7. If you would like to have a loved one remembered, but can't be in church this week, please send the names to Gretchen in the church office.

At 5:00 p.m. that day, we will offer a service of Evening Prayer. Tom and the choir will feature music of Heinrich Schütz and Michael Praetorius, The Rev. Dr. Karen-Louise Walker, Vice President for Development at Ascentria Care Alliance will preach on the work of resettling Afghan evacuees, and a simple supper and conversation with the preacher will follow. Do invite friends, co-workers, family and neighbors to this beautiful liturgy and timely conversation.

Music Notes Tom Berryman, Music Director

Reformation Sunday will be filled with music celebrating the 504th anniversary of Luther's nailing 95 theses on the door of All Saints' Church in Wittenberg AND celebrating the confirmation of three members of Christ Lutheran. Michael Praetorius (1571-1621) was an early Reformation composer, often arranging new Lutheran hymns for choirs. The CLC Choir will be singing his setting of "Lord, keep us steadfast in your word" as the Prelude music. We will also be singing Bob Weaver and William Pasch's setting of the Creed, "We all believe in one true God" as the Offertory Hymn.

Preston Burt will be playing the organ for the closing hymn, *The church's one foundation* and the Postlude, Eugene Gigout's *Toccata in B Minor*. [Here is a performance of the Toccata by a young man in a teaching session with Daniel Roth at St. Sulpice in Paris](#). The sound quality is "informal," but you'll get a sense of the sound of this mighty instrument in a truly magnificent acoustical setting.

Gospel Acclamation Hymn: *Lord, keep us steadfast in your word* ELW 513

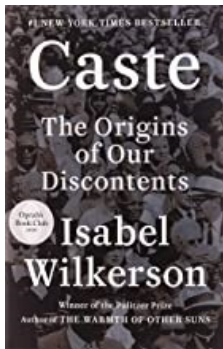
