I relinquish the sign of this office.

# Taste and see that the Lord is good; happy are they who trust in God. For your ministry with us we say: Thanks be to God!

Family is invited to join the pastor at the altar.

Associate to the Bishop:

In holy baptism our Lord Jesus Christ received you and made you a member of God's church. You were welcomed to Christ Lutheran Church along with Pastor Bourret, supporting her and the mission we share as the people of God in this place. Here you have come to know and to share in God's loving purpose for you and for all creation. God has blessed you in this community, and God has blessed the community through you. May you continue to be a blessing to others. Let us pray...

Gracious God, we thank you for the work and witness of your servants, Rebecca and Jeff, and their family, who have enriched this community and brought gladness to friends and family.
