CLC Transition

Transition Team Report to Semi-Annual Meeting 1, January 30, 2022

The Transition Team has begun meeting regularly to oversee the opening stage of the search and call process. Projected to take from 6-9 months, this period involves gathering information about the congregation's history and culture and identifying the congregation's priorities for CLC's mission and ministry, which the Team describes as "finding our why."

The first step in data-gathering will begin in two weeks (around February 13) with a confidential online survey using the Congregational Assessment Tool (CAT) created by *Holy Cow Consulting*. When the results of the survey are analyzed and returned to the Team, assistant to the bishop, the Rev. Sarah Anderson will meet with the Team to review the information.

Members will soon receive a letter outlining the process as well as providing instruction about how to complete the survey. Members who do not have online capability will receive paper versions of the survey in the mail.

The shared results of the initial survey along with three other inter-active congregational events will provide the information necessary for the last step in the Transition Team's work, to write the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) which the bishop and his staff will use to find a good "fit" with a potential candidate for a Call Committee's consideration. The profile in turn provides an overview of the congregation so candidates can assess their "fit."

A Call Committee will be organized after the Transition Team has completed its work. This is when the second stage of the search process begins. Transition Team members will not serve on the Call Committee. At this stage New England Synod staff will identify a potential candidate for the Call Committee to interview. The synod office has advised that it is likely to take longer than in past years to identify a candidate, due to the current shortage of pastors across the country.

The Transition Team invites everyone's participation and prayers as we move through this initial stage of the search and call process.

A Salute to CLC Techies!




Call to Action

Help to make it possible for the Agbodjinou family and others like them to obtain driver's licenses as they move toward self-sufficiency. Driving tests and auto insurance requirements help to ensure the safety of all drivers on the road. 15 other states already issue licenses to drivers regardless of immigration status. Help Massachusetts establish a similar practice.

House bill H. 3456/Senate bill S.2289, the *Work and Family Mobility Act*, has until **Friday, March 4, 2022**, to be reported favorably out of the Joint Transportation Committee. You can call your state legislators or the Joint Transportation Committee to ask for their support of this bill.
