Looking Ahead

Worship, Music, and the Visual Arts Committee is planning the services for**Holy Week** with Pastor Hulse and Music Director Tom Berryman, anticipating a return to our annual in-person gatherings on Palm Sunday and for the three services of Triduum: Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Vigil, followed by one service of celebration on **Easter Sunday**, **April 17**.

After two years of Holy Week and Easter Zoom services WMVA anticipates parading outdoors while waving palms on Sunday, stripping the altar on Maundy Thursday, and venerating the cross on Good Friday. A tent in the parish hall and a blazing fire outdoors, the reading of twelve lessons from the Bible, and a renewal of baptism around the font, followed by Holy Communion mark the significant actions of the Vigil on Saturday. Glorious music and the celebration of the good news of the Resurrection with communion complete the week on Easter Sunday. Mark your calendars and plan to join us for this week of worship.
