SOUR CREAM PASTRIES by Bev Livingston

1 cup butter or margarine
1 beaten egg yolk
¹/₂ cup apricot preserves
1/4 cup pecans , finely chopped

2 cups flour ¹/₂ cup dairy sour cream ¹/₂ cup flaked coconut Granulated sugar

With pastry blender, cut butter or margarine into flour til resembling fine crumbs. Combine egg yok and sour cream and blend into flour mixture. Chill dough several hours or overnight. Divide dough into 4 equal parts. Keep each part refrigerated until ready to use. Roll each part to 10inch circle on lightly floured surface. Spread with 2 tablespoons apricot preserves; sprinkle with 2 tablespoons coconut and 1 tablespoon nuts. Cut each circle into 12 wedges with fluted pastry wheel. Start from wide end and roll each wedge into a crescent. Roll in granulated sugar and place on ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes. Makes 4 dozen. ENJOY!!!



MELTAWAY CHRISTMAS COOKIES

1 c. flour sifted

1 c. cornstarch

 $\frac{1}{2}$ c. powdered sugar ½ tsp. salt 1 tsp. vanilla

1 c. butter softened

Powdered sugar

Sift flour and cornstarch together and set aside. In a large bowl cream

butter, gradually beating in sugar, mix well. Add salt and vanilla, mix together, stir in sifted dry ingredients, mixing well. Refrigerate 2 or 3 hours. Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Shape dough into small balls, place 2 inches apart on ungreased cookie sheet, bake 15 - 20 minutes. While cookies are hot, roll in powdered sugar.

This twelve-day holiday period carried over to America and was a special time for the signing of treaties and for weddings. In our young nation's history, George Washington married the widow Martha Curtis

on Twelfth Day, January 6. Thomas Jefferson married Martha Skelton on New Year's Day in 1772. Although our modern world is too busy for twelve days of holi-

dav.

Christmas is still considered a very special time for weddings.

Christmas trees are relative newcomers to the American Christmas, but the Christmas tree tradition is an ancient one stretching back to ancient Teutonic cultures where the enduring vitality of the winter evergreen was emblematic of the immortality of the soul. Christmas trees in America were first found in the Moravian church's communal settlement at Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, in 1747.
