#### 39th Annual Minnesota FoodShare March Campaign

"Food insecurity means access to adequate food is inconsistent and limited by a lack of money and other resources throughout the year. Food insecure households report their diets to be of reduced quality, variety, or desirability and/or experience disrupted eating patterns and reduced food intake." In 2020, 9% of Minnesotans had incomes below poverty level (\$25,926 for a family of four). This included 11% of Minnesota's children. Semcac's Kasson Food Shelf served 432 households with 2,221 visits and distributed 115,829 pounds of food during 2020. Clients may also receive information and referrals to other community services.

Minnesota FoodShare envisions a Minnesota where all residents have access to healthy food and no one struggles with food insecurity. The March Campaign addresses these issues directly by promoting the collection of food and funds to stock food shelves across the state. As an official participant, Semcac's food shelves will receive a percentage of March FoodShare funds based on donations raised during the campaign and the number of people served in a year.

Semcac is asking service clubs, organizations, businesses, churches, and individuals for their support during March. Please bring donations of funds, food, and personal care items to your local food shelf from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Mondays or Wednesdays. Due to the continued concerns with COVID 19, cash donations are preferred. Donations must be received on or before April 6 to count towards the Minnesota FoodShare March Campaign. Thank you for being part of our efforts to bring food security to our community!

#### Wednesday March 17 at 7pm -Calming the Storm


For this week's The Way: Following in the Footsteps of Jesus study we will explore the story of Jesus calmed the storm at the Sea of Galilee.

#### Children's Sunday School Plan for In-Person Worship

Children's Sunday School classes (the class for younger children and confirmation class) will take place during worship and will last approximately 30 minutes.

Children of the same family will be seated together 6 feet apart from other children outside of their household.


