

#### Now a little Easter folklore:

There is a clean look to a blooming dogwood tree, especially when glimpsed in the wild. This purity of appearance adds credibility to its legend. At the time of the crucifixion of Christ, so the tale is told, the dogwood was tall and straight, the size of oaks and elms. So strong was its wood that it was selected to be used for the timber to build the cross. The tree was appalled to be put to such use. Jesus, sensing its distress, promised that nevermore should the dogwood grow large enough to be used as a cross. He also promised to create for the dogwood a reminder of his death in the form of the flower: four blossoms shaped in the form of a white cross, with a stain at the outer edge of each petal, and in the center a tiny crown of thorns. Today the little dogwood faithfully blooms at Eastertime, relaying to us an ancient reminder of the cycle of winter and spring, death and rebirth.

Has a new and deeper meaning when Easter lilies bloom.






Jesus, our Redeemer, arose on Easter morn,

# Faith in Action of Dodge County Newsletter 1st Quarter 2021

Welcome to Faith in Action's first newsletter. On a quarterly basis we intend to update volunteers of the programs actions and plans. #### 2020 Stats

It is clear to everyone that 2020 was a very unusual year. Still our volunteers were busy helping seniors. A total of 120 senior clients are currently eligible for FIA services. Of our 65 volunteers, currently 11 of them are active. There were a total of 1081 services provided for a total of 7333 service hours. Service miles totaled 7820. During the early height of the Covid19 pandemic, there was little direct contact with clients. However, volunteers committed to call seniors on a weekly basis to check in and offer support when people were so isolated.

Currently, volunteers and seniors are following Covid guidelines while services are provided. Mask up, distance, and sanitize! Thanks to all of you who helped serve seniors in 2020.

## Fundraising 2020

The board made changes in the sliding fee scale effective January 2020. It had not

been adjusted since 2010. The scale continues to allow us to provide services at a cost to clients much less that other service agencies in our area. All of our major fundraisers were canceled in 2020 due to the pandemic.

- Selling ice cream at festivals
- Working at the Kasson Legion
- Annual Soup and Pie Supper
- Working at Berne Pizza

While we do not have a large budget, staff salary, office supplies, insurance, mileage, etc are expenses that must be covered. Board chair, Lynn Knutson, did a great job of applying for available grants and loans. Those funds along with client fees, Dodge County funds allowed Faith in Action to continue to match volunteers with seniors.

#### Volunteer Recruitment

There is a definite need for more active volunteers. We understand that there are times when volunteers must step back. Needs of seniors, however, continue. Consequently, we are actively seeking additional volunteers and encouraging current volunteers to serve whenever possible. Board members met with local pastors sharing FIA information and asking for their help in education their congregations about our services to seniors and need for additional volunteers. We ran an ad in the local newspaper for Dodge Center, Claremont and West Concord, The Messenger. Talk with your friends and family about FIA and invite them to become volunteers. ## Wednesday April 14 at 7pm "Why God Gave Choice"


