Our Memorial Funds at Work

You may have noticed a few new things at the church since we've gotten back into the building for Worship and Fellowship. You also may be wondering how we were able to make these improvements while our congregation was not meeting in person for worship.

Some committees worked remotely through the pandemic, and the gifts listed below are the results of those efforts. Feedback received from various members of our congregation prompted some of the changes. All of the recommended improvements to our church were prayerfully considered by the members of the committees and by the Session and were paid for with special memorial donations; neither general offerings nor budgeted funds were used.

As mentioned in previous newsletters, the new Glory to God hymnal that is now at home in our pews was a purchase made using funds designated for music by the Delores Himle Memorial account. The new air filtration systems seen at the rear of the sanctuary and in the Golden Room were purchased to provide a healthier environment for our congregation while in the building, again, a gift from the Delores Himle Memorial account.

The new blue pew cushions, the church's redesigned website by a professional company, and the updated sound and camera equipment for recording our services were donated by the Dan & Marie Kaufeld Memorial account. The sound and camera equipment was also funded by a memorial gift for John Schwen.

We have new Celebration of Life banners that were donated by the Thomas & Helen Ferry Memorial account. We have also received two grants that Pastor Amanda applied for through our presbytery that will be used to improve our technology systems at the church. One was for \$200 and the other was for \$2,500.

To recognize these generous gifts purchased to glorify God, we will have a special Dedication Service to receive them on Sunday, September 19th. It will be a day of celebration with Sunday School once again being in session and the choir singing joyfully for worship.Please mark your calendars and come celebrate the day that the Lord has made!

<u>We need new deacons, ruling elders, and nominating</u> <u>committee members and we need your help!</u>

This year the nominating committee is distributing nomination forms for officers. We want the congregation to think about who has gifts to serve and could be a great leader as a deacon or ruling elder or nominating committee member next year.

Below are the requirements and job description. Nomination forms will be on the back table of the fellowship hall. Please turn them into the church office.

First Presbyterian Church Nomination for Officers

Please prayerfully consider nominations for the next class of church officers. These are very important roles of service and responsibility. You can submit your nomination form directly to the church office, to a Nominating Committee member or via email to presbykasson@kmtel.com. The Nomination Forms will be available through the month of September.

Consider the following qualifications before completing the form: <u>Church Involvement</u>

- regular attendance at Sunday worship and participation in church activities
- areas of service in church ministries
- demonstration of commitment to the church and its mission

Christian Living

- love of Jesus Christ and dedication to Christ as Lord and Savior
- strong faith
- demonstration of grace and compassion in common life (family, work, community)
- spiritual maturity
- acceptance of the Bible as the unique and authoritative witness to God's work in the world and guide for Christian living

Personal Characteristics and Skills

- cooperativeness; willingness to learn and listen
- ability to follow through on assignments
- openness to new ideas

FAQ's about serving on church leadership: Deacon

What is a deacon?

A deacon is a servant of the church, they participate in the caring for church members. It is the duty of deacons to minister to those who are in need, to the sick, to the friendless, and to any who may be in distress both within and beyond the community of faith.

What gifts are required?

A heart for people. The gifts of sympathy, compassion, and sound judgment in ministry to others.

What is the time commitment of a deacon?

Deacons meet at least four times per year. (September, November, February, May) If deacons are helping with special church events, other meetings may be needed. Deacons serve for three years.

What is a ruling elder?

Ruling Elder

A ruling elder is a member of Session. Ruling elders, together with ministers of word and sacrament, exercise leadership, government, spiritual discernment, and discipline and have responsibilities for the life of a congregation as well as the whole church.

What gifts are required?

The gifts of good judgment and fair-mindedness. They need to be a spiritual leader with a vision to provide oversight and direction for the congregation. They need to care about Christian education and worship. Ruling elders are responsible for ensuring that worship happens each Sunday morning.

What is the time commitment to be a Ruling Elder?

Ruling elders are expected to attend monthly Session meetings. Session currently meets the second Monday of the month at 7:00 pm. Ruling elders are also expected to serve on at least one church committee. Depending on the committee that could be a monthly, quarterly, or twice a year commitment. Ruling elders are asked to attend one Presbytery meeting during their time on Session. Ruling elders serve for three years on Session.

What else do Ruling Elders need to do?

They are expected to read the monthly documents in preparation of the Session meeting. Ruling elders need to attend all stated and special Session meeting. Ruling elders are expected to support the decisions of Session

I served on Session years ago. Has anything changed?

Pastor Amanda does her best to keep Session meetings to an hour and tries to give advance notice if the meeting will go longer. We have adopted a consent agenda which means that committees do not read their meeting minutes during the Session meeting. This has saved us time and has given us the opportunity to focus on other church needs.

Nominating Committee Member

What does a nominating committee member do?

Nominating committee members are expected to find new candidates for church leadership- deacons and ruling elders. This is done with input from the congregation.

What gifts do I need to serve on nominating committee?

Members are encouraged to have the gifts of spiritual discernment. They need a wide knowledge of members of the congregation and to seek God's will for the leadership of the congregation.


What is the time commitment to serve on Nominating committee?

Members are expected to attend three meetings- August, September, and October. Nominating committee members-at-large only serve for one year
