Blue Christmas Service - Sunday, December 12 at 4:00 PM



Here's what we are studying in December:



Tuesday December at 7pm- Advent Bible Study- Faithful: Christmas Through the Eyes of Joseph-Whose Child is This?

In Session 2, we consider the ancestry of Jesus through Joseph, Joseph's righteousness, and God's call for us to offer mercy, grace, and forgiveness to others.

Tuesday December 14 at 7pm - Advent Bible Study- Faithful: Christmas Through the Eyes of Joseph-Raising A Child Not Your Own

In Session 3, Adam Hamilton makes the point that we experience joy when we accept God's call to reach out and serve others. Hamilton identifies three specific ways we may reach out in service that are based on the life of Joseph.

The season of Thanksgiving is upon us, so is the stress of the holidays and an ongoing pandemic. Giving thanks or feeling grateful can have health benefits, especially when done on a regular basis. When we feel grateful, our body calms and we feel more at peace. Practicing gratitude daily has been shown to significantly increase happiness, improve sleep, boost immunity, and decrease the risk of disease. Here are a few ideas to incorporate gratitude into your daily life. You can keep a gratitude journal, every day writing a few quick notes. This could be something funny your child or grandchild did, a kind gesture of a stranger at the store, or any positive thought. You can use gratitude cues, such as using photos

of things or people that make you happy or posting inspirational quotes on your fridge or by your computer where you would see them. You could make a gratitude jar, asking family members to write on a piece of paper one thing they are grateful for every day and drop it in the jar, you could try to make this funny. You can also try thinking of something or someone you are grateful for every night before you go to sleep or when you wake up. Using meditation or mindfulness can also be helpful. Some mindfulness exercises include paying attention to the environment with all of your senses, focusing on your breathing, living in the moment, and treating yourself the way you would treat a good friend.




